It serves as the basis for discussion with parents/guardians and as a support for parents'/guardians' ongoing participation in their child's learning.

Also, on November 16, parents of students in Grades 1-8 will receive their Elementary Progress Reports. Although it looks much like the Report Card, the Progress Report has a very different intent. The purpose is to share early and specific feedback on your child's development of work habits and the learning skills. Reporting on the Progress Report is about looking forward and setting a course for the learning journey ahead.

Based on the evidence that teachers see, as well as what teachers know about learning at this grade level, the report communicates the path your child is on towards achieving the grade level expectations by the end of the year. The Progress Report does not include letter grades or percentage marks for academic subjects; it instead identifies whether your child is progressing very well, well or with difficulty. For subjects in which your child is 'Progressing with Difficulty', the teacher will discuss specific next step plans needed for success. Progress reports are intended to be part of discussions, interviews, or conferences with students and are part of ongoing communication with parents and students about student achievement throughout the year.

REMEMBRANCE DAY

On Friday, November 10, the staff and students at Valley Way will participate in a Remembrance Day assembly and will recognize a moment of silence. We would like to take this opportunity to honour all that have given of themselves to serve Canada. Students involved in cadets or scouting are invited to wear their uniforms. Due to limited space and maximum capacity of our school gym, our assembly will not be open to community members and families. Students will be provided with a sticker poppy if they choose to wear one for the day.

If you cannot access the Safe Arrival System, please call the school as we have an answering machine after hours which will take your messages. Any unexplained absence will be checked using our call-back system. This means we will call home/work to find out where your child is.



We know that some mornings, despite best efforts, students occasionally arrive late. Your child's safety and whereabouts are critical to us, because of this, it is essential for us to know when your child is absent or late from school. Please use the REPORT AN ABSENCE link on our school website or call the school if your child is going to be late.

Being on time for school is an important habit to teach your child. We stress the need for every student to be at school on time in order not to miss important lessons or information being shared. Late students must report to the office to obtain a late slip for their teacher.

It's the season – Cold & Flu

Respiratory illness season has arrived and isn't going anywhere anytime soon. Cold, flu, COVID-19 and RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) are all in the mix.

Keeping up to date with vaccines can activate you and your child's immune system's natural fighting ability. Our immune system uses vaccines to practice fighting germs so it knows what to do when faced with them. Getting an <u>XBB COVID-19 dose</u> and a <u>flu shot</u> will give the immune system a much-needed top up - just like charging a cell phone battery.



It's safe to take the flu shot and fall 2023 COVID-19 dose at the same

time. These vaccines may also be given any time before or after other vaccines, like the ones offered to grade 7 students.

Head Lice



Students are now back into the swing of things and spending lots of time with friends and classmates during school and after school. Lice can spread regardless of a student's age. Head lice are spread by direct head-to-head contact or by sometimes sharing items like

combs, brushes, hats, pillows, etc. Anyone can get head lice, it's not a sign of poor personal hygiene or an unclean environment.
